The Government has announced plans to boost self-build by removing the main barriers



He has announced a collaboration with experts at the National Self Build Association (NaSBA) - of which HB&R is a member who will help develop an action plan to make it easier for people to build their own homes. 
* Availability of land including making public sector land available for housebuilding
